Successful first STSM

The first STSM has been completed. Dr. Saverio Fabbri spent two months at PARCC-INSERM U970, Paris, France working with Prof. Pierre Boutouyrie and Dr. Rosa Maria Bruno on the COVID-19 Effects on arterial stiffness and vascular aging (CARTESIAN) study. Dr Saverio had the opportunity to learn how to measure vascular ageing by different techniques and interpret vascular data using the appropriate technological tools

WG1- Dynamic Exchange

WG2- Physiological and Technical Background

WG2 members continue working in small groups write three position/consensus/review papers: (i) Theories of vascular ageing and biomarkers (in collaboration with WG3); (ii) The value of mathematical models in vascular ageing, and (iii) Arterial pulse wave modelling and analysis for vascular ageing assessment. The group is also contributing to the VascAgeNet glossary on biomarkers. Other highlights include a VascAgeNet webinar given by Elena Osto (Task 2.3 lead) titled Endothelial dysfunction, ageing and COVID-19 and three research presentations: (i) Arterial ageing in the middleaged: 10 years follow-up data in the Asklepios population by Daimé Campos and (ii) Impact of cocoa flavanol intake on age-dependent vascular stiffness by Christian Heiss ans (iii) Targeted Delivery of Atorvastatin by Aptamer Gated Silica Nanoparticles in Atherosclerosis Cell Culture Mode by Elif Oztemiz. WG3- Technological aspects

WG3 members continue to work in the 6 different original subgroups 1) Invasive, 2) Imaging (including MRI/CT and Ultrasound), 3) Oscillometry, 4) Tonometry, 5) Photoplethysmography/Contactless, 6) Chemical/Score, where they are finalising comprehensive reviews of each vascular ageing technique with validation of methods based on the available data on the literature. A new subgroup has been created in collaboration with WG2 that will create a framework for selection of circulating biomarkers and risk scores related to vascular ageing. A new project on atrial fibrillation has also been launched. The vascular ageing Glossary collaboration with WG1 is progressing well and will be available on the website soon.

WG4- Data and Studies

The WG4 subgroups on cfPWV, baPWV, central hemodynamics and endothelial function are working to identify gaps in the literature. They are currently performing 6 systematic reviews. The Carotid subgroup are writing a MSCA-Doctorate's proposal, evaluating synergies between different PhD projects and general framework of the proposal. They are also collaborating with WG3 to review the technical validation of ultrasound biomarkers of vascular ageing. The Youth Vascular Consortium is launched and data collection is progressing well. The Big data subgroup report on data structure is well advanced and templates are under construction. The WG4 nucleus are working to align all subgroup activities, launch new subgroups and develop the registry structure. The Sex and Gender expert group have completed a review highlighting sex and gender aspects in vascular ageing. The Covid-19 effects on ARTErial Stlffness and vascular AgiNg study has reached 700 recruited patients! We sincerely thanks all the investigators for the wonderful job!

WG5 are finalising the state-of-the-art review that addresses the key questions of vascular ageing. The educational webinars have been a great success and will continue to feature every month. The vascular ageing Survey is ready for international dissemination and the first *Vascular Ageing Awareness Day* is being planned.
